Following the Boundary Commission's publication of its revised proposals for Parliamentary Boundaries, I'm delighted that Mid Norfolk is a "Continuity" Constituency with only minor changes to the boundary, and to be able to confirm that I intend to stand again for election as the Member of Parliament for Mid Norfolk to continue my *Norfolk Way* crusade for a Rural Renaissance— and in particular my work on:

- Better connectivity (digital, rail, bus, bike and road links, as well improved broadband and mobile signal)
- Increased investment in our innovation economy to support the high growth small businesses driving the Norfolk Innovation Economy
- Modernisation of our public services, especially integrated healthcare providing properly integrated services for patients and the vulnerable in social care, mental health, dementia, disabilities and SEND

Should the Boundary Commission's revised proposals be adopted as expected, I will be sorry to lose the beautiful and historic town of Wymondham and some of its surrounding villages, as well as a handful of other wonderful communities like Ashill and North Pickenham, which it has been an honour and privilege to represent in Parliament for over 12 years. (I remain committed to serving them right until the moment they are no longer in Mid Norfolk and will provide any assistance their new MPs may require in picking up the key issues in those areas).

I look forward, however, to continuing my work to help ensure the transition of Mid Norfolk from a long neglected rural backwater to a better connected hub of rural enterprise, innovation and opportunity for all the people in this special part of our county.
